## Irene Virag Receives B. Y. Morrison Communication Award

Alexandria, VA (March 2008). Irene Virag is one of 13 outstanding members of the horticultural community who will be honored by the American Horticultural Society (AHS) during its Great American Gardeners Awards Ceremony and Banquet on June 6, 2008. Virag is this year's recipient of the AHS's B. Y. Morrison Communication Award, which previously was known as the Horticultural Communication Award. This award recognizes effective and inspirational communication — through print, radio, television, and/or online media — that advances public interest and participation in horticulture.

Virag has been Newsday's garden columnist since 1995. She is now a freelance writer whose work has appeared in magazines such as *Better Homes & Gardens Special Interest Publications* and *Fine Gardening*. Virag has a journalism degree from Boston University. After earning a master's degree at Northwestern University's Medill School of Journalism, she went to Harvard University on a Nieman Fellowship. She joined *Newsday* in the 1980s and was a member of a team that won a Pulitzer Prize for local reporting in 1986. She later became editor of the newspaper's "Home and Garden" section.

Virag is a Fellow of the Garden Writers Association and has won that organization's top award for newspaper writing. She is an inspirational public speaker and the author of *Gardening on Long Island with Irene Virag* (Newsday Books, 1999). She teaches Narrative Journalism at Stony Brook University on Long Island.
